Enclosed are the Pink and Yellow sheets from our February clinics in Oklahoma. I know Ruth has sent you the preliminary totals. she asked me to send you these sheets, also.

We appreciated your support of \$5000 for rural Oklahoma spay/neuter clinics. Overall, the OAA "It's Hip to Snip" campaign in honor of the Doris Day Foundation Spay Day USA surpassed our goal of 1,000 surgeries.


We had some startling statistics:

- 1,061 surgeries were performed by 4 veterinarians.
- 100% of pet owners had incomes less than \$40,000.
- Over 62% of our clients (661 pet owners) had incomes less than \$15,000.
- 262 surgeries were subsidized by your \$5000 grant for rural Oklahomans at a cost of \$19.08/surgery. Rural Clinics were conducted in Durant, Cushing, Clayton, Bristow, Henryetta, and Claremore. These communities represent some of the poorest in our state.
- Spay Oklahoma in Tulsa achieved a new record of 648 surgeries in one month!

By asking people to contribute to their pet's health we generate program revenue for our clinics and the owners feel a sense of contribution. Your gift from the Doris Day Animal Foundation helped bridge the gap between what low-income families can afford to pay and the actual cost of surgery (approximately \$45/surgery).

Overall, we are very pleased with our efforts and hope you are too. We look forward to working with you in the future.
